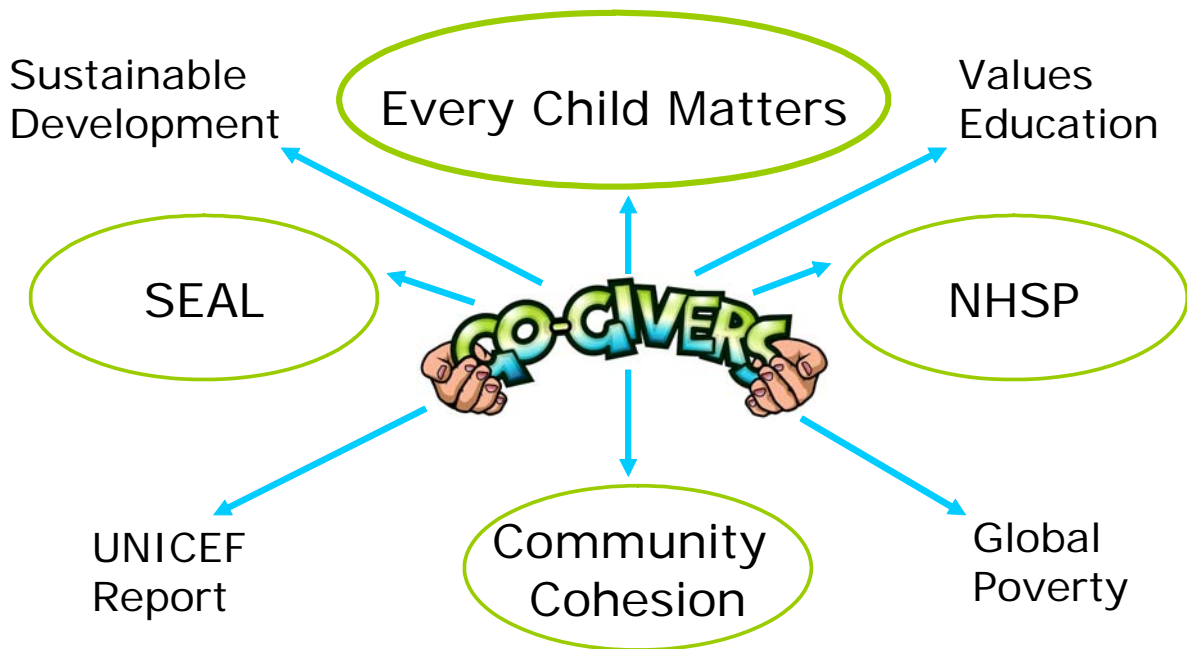


Links with Other Initiatives and Issues

Go-Givers extends the **SEAL** (Social, Emotional Aspects of Learning) and **Healthy Schools** programmes into the wider context of society. It addresses many of the requirements of the DCSF '**Guidance to Promote Community Cohesion**' document which becomes statutory in September 2007. It also deals with important issues raised in the **UNICEF Commission on the Rights of the Child**.



HOW GO-GIVERS HELPS TO MEET THE AIMS OF 'EVERY CHILD MATTERS'

Organisations involved with providing services to young people are now required to work together with the aim of protecting them from harm and helping them to fulfill their potential and achieve what they want in life. They are required to take into account their views about issues that affect them as individuals and collectively.

Go-Givers helps children understand how significant issues in the world today can shape the society they live in, and impinge on their place in it. It provides them with role models, space to reflect on their particular talents and values, and opportunities to set goals for the future.

Go-Givers seeks to clarify children's understanding of rights and responsibilities and encourages children to take an active role in their community.

Whilst we would wish all children to grow up to be confident, assertive '**Go-Getters**' achieving economic well-being, we think it equally important to cultivate in our children concern to act fairly, and to inspire compassion linked to social and moral responsibility, leading them to become active '**Go-Givers**' with deeper meaning to their lives.

Evidence shows that children learn best through active participation. Go-Givers activities allow for maximum creativity and individual expression on the part of the learner. Our intention has been to motivate the young people to engage in further research and autonomous action.

THE CONTRIBUTION OF GO-GIVERS TO THE HEALTHY SCHOOLS PROGRAMME

The National Healthy Schools programme involves the whole school community in improving their health and happiness and getting the most out of life. The aims of the NHSP are:

- to support children and young people in developing healthy behaviours
- to help to raise pupil achievement
- to help to reduce health inequalities
- to help promote social inclusion.

Go-Givers supports schools in providing a broader perspective on these issues, enabling children to see how they fit within the context of society. The programme fosters children's awareness of disadvantage and changing needs, including puberty, old age, illness and disability. It also enhances the skills of communication, and participation in the local, national and global communities.

THE CONTRIBUTION OF GO-GIVERS TO THE SEAL PROGRAMME

Go-Givers extends the SEAL programme into the wider context of society.

Every society in the world has to balance off the tensions between harnessing individuals' ambitions for personal achievement, and the needs of the wider community. This perennial tension that often leads to imbalance: to 'haves and have-nots' finds expression every day in the simple interactions of children and adults. The same social learning that informs how we share, care and cooperate in the classroom finds immediate comparisons in our social systems. These values are the bedrock of functioning democracy, no matter the colour of the ruling political party.

Go-Givers demonstrates how we might restore compassion for one another as human beings. Instead of competing we should try to co-operate. Instead of fighting, we should seek to compromise. Instead of hoarding we should share, because the only way we are going to achieve happiness as a society is *together*.

The Go-Givers programme contributes to the social and emotional aspects of learning; self-awareness, managing feelings, motivation, empathy and social skills; by developing the following attitudes:

- Empathy
- Care
- Respect for other people's views and experience
- Concern to act fairly
- A spirit of enquiry
- An optimistic standpoint.

HOW GO-GIVERS HELPS TO PROMOTE COMMUNITY COHESION

There is now an expectation on schools to play an explicit role in creating integrated, harmonious communities. This relates to the life of the pupils in the school, and also the school in the wider community. Go Givers helps to educate pupils as members of a more cohesive society and also as a school community more able to influence the local community.

Go Givers helps children to:

- Prioritise according to Human Rights/Children's Rights,
- Understand the importance of giving everyone similar life opportunities,
- Acknowledge rights and responsibilities
- Appreciate the diversity of people's backgrounds, values and customs.
- Recognise and challenge stereotypes/bias
- Develop positive relationships with a variety of people
- Know what makes a responsible Citizen.

One feature of the Go-Givers site, the 'Noproblemo Show', is an interactive device which helps young people decide how they can make a contribution to the world they live in. The 'Toolkit', in the children's section, also supports children in taking an active role in their communities, and could help facilitate a school-wide initiative. Schools may find the modules below particularly helpful in promoting community cohesion

HOW GO-GIVERS ADDRESSES THE ISSUES RAISED IN THE UNICEF REPORT

The overall OECD league table of young people's risk behaviours sees the UK at the foot of the rankings by "a considerable distance".

The percentage of children who report that their peers are 'kind and helpful' varies from a high of 80 percent or more in Switzerland and Portugal to less than 50 percent in the Czech Republic and the United Kingdom.

Go-Givers is a programme which supports the development of caring citizens. We believe that our children's education should have its basis in a philosophy of personal and social responsibility, mutual respect and concern for the world we live in. The purpose of the project is to create '*Ripples of Care across the World*' by educating children to care for their family and friends, and about issues relating to the local and global community. A basic premise of Go-Givers is the development of a lifelong commitment to voluntary giving.

Teachers who have adopted the Go Givers materials often remind us that it has given them the opportunity to fulfil some of the ambitions that inspired into teaching in the first place: to influence a new generation to be more fulfilled, capable and supportive, to somehow play their part in changing the culture of the nation. We believe this! That change comes one step at a time when everyone joins in, it starts with 'me' and it can be infectious!

The Go-Givers site includes a 'Kindness Kit' which recognizes and celebrates positive behaviour.

Modules which expressly encourage consideration for others, and dissuade young people from participating in risk behaviours include the following:

THE CONTRIBUTION OF GO-GIVERS TO THE NATIONAL CPD PROGRAMMES

There are currently two nationally accredited CPD (continuing professional development) programmes for teachers of Personal, Social and Health education (PSHE) and Citizenship. They are

- **The National PSHE CPD programme**
